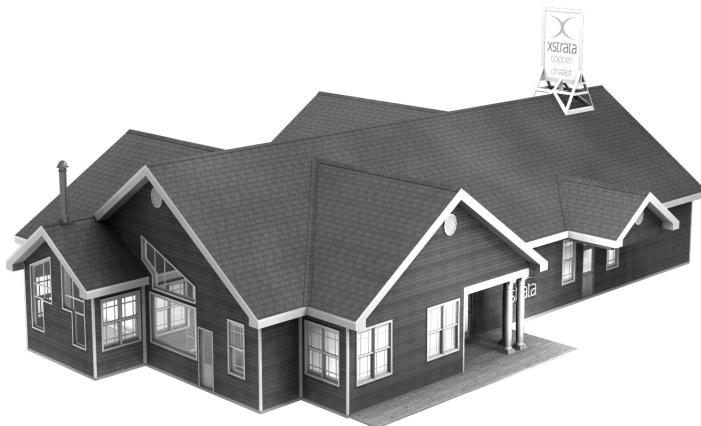

President's Message

Our 35th season has come and gone with great success. We started skiing at the club the third week of November and skied continuously until mid April. Actually, Robert Coderre recorded the last ski, 15 km, on April 21.

We had 5 months of great skiing with relatively warm weather and plenty of snow. Our membership (1200) was the second highest in our history. I've talked to quite a few people skiing at our club from other parts of the province this season who have told me we are lucky to have perfectly groomed trails so close to the centre of the City.

According to some, our trails are amongst the best anywhere. After thanking them for the compliment, I couldn't help but mention that luck was only part of our situation. Our facilities resulted from the foresight of our early members and the hard work of dedicated volunteers throughout the club's history.

However, we are not resting on our laurels. Headed by the hardworking McNairs, our million-dollar Nordic Centre Project is well on the way to completion this fall.

We have had a very busy, eventful season. Highlights include:

- a great year for Jackrabbits with no cancellations due to cold conditions
- the highest number ever for people skiing over 2000 kms

- an enthusiastic response to Cross Country Canada's Sea2Sea competition
- Natasha Kullas winning a bronze medal for our club at the national championships
- Jessica Demers winning gold and bronze medals at the Ontario Winter Games
- Mike Sech skiing 119 days at 86 years old and Anne Mascioli skiing 583 kms over 55 days at age 82 proving that the sport is one that can last a lifetime
- a very successful 28th annual loppet
- Wendy and Dave Mairs reviving a great 12 hour challenge
- Hosting a training camp for Ontario racers
- Our learn to ski (loppet) sessions
- The racing team earning record funds with the ski swap and waxing bees
- The first ever Reel Paddling Film Fest spearheaded by Diane Luhta being a success as a Nordic Centre fund raiser

Thank you to all the volunteers who have dedicated their time to our programs and events, the new Nordic centre, trail grooming, equipment and facilities maintenance, brush cutting and club administration.

I invite all of you out to our annual meeting **June 3 at 7:00 P.M.** at the Schumacher Lion's Den at the McIntyre Community Centre. Membership Report

Those last two members that joined the club in March, William and Jeannine Eaton, brought the total to an even 1200 members. That's the second highest number of members in the club's history and the 1271 achieved in the 2005-06 season remains the record.

Some details:

1. There were 576 membership applications with 1200 members.
2. We had 306 *Family* applications.
3. *Adult* applications totaled 190.
4. There were 51 *Senior* applications.
5. And 29 *Student* applications.
6. We have 68 more female members than male members. (634 vs. 566 – The guys never win this category.)

We expect to have a very busy summer and the fall is always busy as we get ready for the next season. Volunteers, as willing workers, are always needed. At the Annual General Meeting, there will be a motion to revise membership fees for the 2008-09 season. The proposed increase in fees is required to pay for the increases in our operating costs. Energy (electricity, propane, diesel and gasoline) costs are leading the way but our registration with Cross Country Canada (which includes our liability insurance) has also

increased along with most other expenses.

Seven films were shown; some of them short clips taken from full-length films, and some full-length documentaries. Insane white water kayaking in Mexico and the NWT, peaceful sea kayaking in the Queen Charlotte Islands with the whales, canoeing the beautiful Dumoine River in Quebec, driving from Alaska to Argentina on vegetable oil while kayaking local rivers were just some of the topics shown to the enthusiastic crowd.

A popular and emotionally moving film was 49 Megawatts, which focused on the damming of the Ashlu River in Squamish BC. It appeared that the democratic process was corrupted by big money and big government ignored local citizens' desires.

The Save High Falls group had a display at the film fest and moviegoers were encouraged to support the project.

The junior team attended 3 Ontario Cup races and the Sault Ste Marie Invitational /OWG selection race. Sam Demers, Jessica Demers, Robin Secord, Ethan Mc Gillis, Ryan Allard, Marie Louise Roy and Elizabeth Roy were selected to attend the Ontario Winter Games.

Race support was also provided to PSR alumni - junior /senior women racers Mallory Deyne, Martha Sutton, and Andrea Dupont at some Ontario Cups. Mallory, and Andrea were joined by Natasha Kullas for the 2008 Ski Nationals in BC, where Greg Deyne provided waxing support in some of the world's most challenging snow conditions at Callaghan Valley.

- Natasha Kullas who came back from school in the US to race at Nationals winning a bronze medal in the 15k classic.

Nordic Centre Project – An Update

The planning committee for the Nordic Centre Project is pleased to announce that the construction phase of the new centre will begin this summer.

Planning this project has been quite a roller coaster ride. Based on cost estimates that we now have, the initial wish list of features and size would have resulted in a project valued at over \$1.75 million dollars. Since it was obvious to us that this was not a realistic objective, we did two things:

- 1.) downscaled our wish list and
- 2.) provided flexibility in the design of the project.

The revised plan will allow us to tailor the project to match our available funding.

We estimate that the whole project – upgrade to septic system and water line, improvement to the access road and parking lot and new chalet construction – would cost over \$1,500,000. To date our fund-raising efforts have yielded about \$1,000,000. This does not include any value placed on volunteer labour nor does it include any in-kind contributions of building supplies. For one million dollars we can proceed with the project but the resulting chalet will be less than optimum. It will be stripped of the kitchen, a second gathering area and the locker room will be able to hold only about 130 lockers – which is the number of lockers that we presently have.

Our real objective is to include the kitchen (also storage room and

woodshed) and expand the locker room to hold over 200 lockers. This will place the price tag at about \$1.2 million. We think this is possible. The building is designed such that some of the finishing work can be completed by volunteers – so let's do that and reduce the price. Several suppliers are willing to provide in-kind discount pricing for buildings materials. Let's make that work. And lastly, let's raise a little more money.

We are continuing with our fund-raising activities. For example on Friday, April 25 Porcupine Ski Runners hosted a Reel Paddling Film Festival bringing in about \$2,000. The Loppet organizers contributed \$660 to the project. Diane and Lorne Luhta's 'Learn to Loppet' initiative netted a \$2,200 contribution to the project. We are also continuing to promote our 'Buy a Locker' campaign where a gift of \$200 will ensure that a plaque with your name will be placed on a locker in the new building. At this time only 34 lockers have been sold; there are at least 150 more available.

We must also recognize the generous contributions from all three levels of government but especially those from the Ontario government – Northern Ontario Heritage Fund (NOHFC), Rural Economic Development (RED) and Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF). The City of Timmins is supporting the project and the federal government is also contributing through FedNor.

Thanks to the schools that have contributed funds to the project.

Thank you to all our members who continue to demonstrate that you are among the best volunteers in our community. Many of you contribute both time and money. We continue to depend on your support – particularly this fall when we believe that many finishing touches to the new building can be done by our member volunteers.

Le projet centre nordique – un compte rendu

C'est avec plaisir que le comité de planification du projet centre nordique annonce que nous espérons initier la phase construction du nouveau centre cet été.

Les membres du comité de planification et les directeurs du club se sont rendus compte que la réalisation du projet tel que conçu originalement pourrait coûter plus de 1 750 000\$. Pour nous permettre d'atteindre notre but il nous a fallu réduire nos attentes et introduire un élément de flexibilité dans la phase construction. D'après les prévisions budgétaires, réaliser tout le projet coûtera 1 500 000\$. Lorsqu'on parle du projet on réfère aux améliorations de la fosse septique, de l'adduction d'eau, du chemin d'accès, du parc de stationnement ainsi que la construction d'un nouveau chalet.

Jusqu'à date nos efforts de prélèvement de fonds nous ont

remporté 1 000 000\$. Il est très difficile de placer une valeur monétaire sur le travail qui sera contribué par les bénévoles ainsi que sur le matériel que les pourvoyeurs locaux veulent contribuer à un bon prix. Nous avons tout de même conclu que le projet peut procéder.

Nous voulons vraiment inclure

dans cette phase de construction une cuisine et un total de 200 casiers – une augmentation de 70. Nous croyons que ceci est possible pour un coût de 1 200 000\$. Nous comptons sur nos bénévoles pour la finition et sur les fournisseurs pour leurs contributions.

Nous continuons nos efforts pour atteindre notre but initial. Par exemple, Porcupine Ski Runners parraine une soirée de films de canotage et kayak vendredi le 25 avril. Un grand merci à Northern Tel, Pro Tackle, Post 392, Tim Hortons – nos commandites de cette veillée. Nous continuons aussi à vendre des plaques de casier – un don de 200\$ vous assure que votre nom sera inscrit

sur un des casiers du nouveau centre. Les responsables qui ont organisé le Loppet annuel ont contribué 660\$ au projet. Lorne et Diane Luhta, les responsables de l'initiative "Learn to Loppet" ont contribué 2200\$ au projet.

Il nous faut aussi reconnaître les énormes contributions de tous les niveaux gouvernementaux mais spécialement celles du gouvernement d'Ontario. Presqu'un tiers des montants nous parvient du gouvernement provincial.

Merci aussi à vous les membres qui continuez à démontrer que vous êtes parmi les meilleurs bénévoles de la communauté. Plusieurs parmi vous donnent généreusement – soit de votre temps et ou en argent. Merci aussi aux écoles qui ont recueilli des fonds pour la construction du chalet.

Nous comptons sur votre appui continu – surtout à l'automne lorsque certains aspects de finition pourraient être complétés par nos membres.
